Conveyance Mechanic License Application

Title 9 Article 5.5 Section 106 Colorado Revised Statutes (C.R.S.) of the Elevator and Escalator Certification Act, requires that all conveyance mechanics be licensed by the Colorado Division of Oil and Public Safety (OPS) in order to erect, construct, alter, replace, maintain, remove, or dismantle a conveyance within a building or structure. To be considered for licensing, the applicant must submit to the OPS this application form, information described in Proof of Qualification below, and the application fee.  Proof of Qualification (one of the following as an attachment): Certification that the applicant has completed and successfully passed the mechanic examination of an OPS-approved training program [§ 9-5.5-107(1)(a) C.R.S.]. Proof that the applicant holds a valid license from another state that, as determined by the OPS, has standards similar to those imposed by § 9-5.5-101 through 120 C.R.S. Documentation must also include contact information of the license issuing agency. Proof that the applicant has 3 years of work experience (1,700 hours per year) as a conveyance mechanic without supervision on specific conveyance equipment listed in the type of license checked above. Documentation must include personnel records that indicate the timeframe and listing of hours for the experience and must indicate on what types of conveyances the applicant performed work. This method of licensing requires the applicant to also receive a passing score on an examination provided by the OPS on the codes and standards that relate to the type of license checked above. 								
Proof of experience working on escalators and moving walks.								
□ For Type 1 and 4 licensees to perform work on escalators and moving walks, the licensee must comply with Section 3-1-1 (3) or the Conveyance Regulations (7 CCR 1101-8) regarding experience on this equipment.								
For License Renewal only: Proof that the applicant has completed at least 8 hours of OPS-approved continuing education every 2								
years. This continuing education must be completed in the previous 12 months prior to license renewal. □ Proof of experience working on escalators and moving walks as described above.
